

CDC: Swine flu has sickened 22 million in 6 months

(AP) -- Government health officials say swine flu has sickened about 22 million Americans since April.

They say about 4,000 have died, including 540 children.

The startling new figures - about four times higher than previous death estimates - don't mean swine flu has suddenly gotten worse. Instead, the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> on Thursday called them a long-awaited better attempt to understand the virus' true toll.

The CDC now believes that about 98,000 people have been hospitalized in the first six months of the nation's <u>swine flu</u> epidemic, including 36,000 children.
