

Hospital hypoglycemia rates up in black men with diabetes

Adline Ghazi, M.D., from the Medstar Good Samaritan Hospital in Baltimore, and colleagues used an automated research tool that searched electronic clinical data to identify all adults with type 2 diabetes 65 years of age and older admitted to medical or surgical wards between January 2006 and December 2009 (650 patients; 52.6 percent white and 47.4



percent African-American). Hypoglycemia was defined as blood glucose
