

Impaired survival with LVEF below 60 percent in aortic stenosis

ventricular ejection fraction (LVEF) below 60 percent is associated with impaired survival, according to a study published online Dec. 27 in *JACC: Cardiovascular Interventions*.

Tomohiko Taniguchi, M.D., from the Kyoto University Graduate School of Medicine in Japan, and <u>colleagues</u> examined the prognostic impact of LVEF in 3,794 patients with severe AS. The patients were categorized into four groups according to LVEF at index echocardiography:
