

Cap'n crunch cereal recalled due to Salmonella scare

(HealthDay)—A small number of boxes of Cap'n Crunch's Peanut

Butter Crunch are being recalled due to potential *Salmonella* contamination, Quaker Oats says.

The [recall](#) is for 21 boxes bought after Nov. 5 at Super Target Stores in Omaha and Lincoln, Nebraska, and in Wichita, Kansas, and at P-Fresh stores in St. Louis and Blue Springs, Missouri. The 17.1-ounce boxes have UPC code 0 30000 6211 1 and best-before dates of July 30, 2019, or July 31, 2019.

No illnesses related to the products have been reported, according to the company.
