

Infants born weighing <400 g who survive at risk for severe morbidity

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(HealthDay)—One-fifth of infants born with a birth weight (BW) less

than 400 g survive to 18 to 26 months' corrected age, but they are at high risk for neurodevelopmental impairment, according to a study published online March 25 in *JAMA Pediatrics*.

Jane E. Brumbaugh, M.D., from the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, and [colleagues](#) used data from the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development Neonatal Research Network to retrospectively review outcomes of 205 liveborn infants with a BW

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
