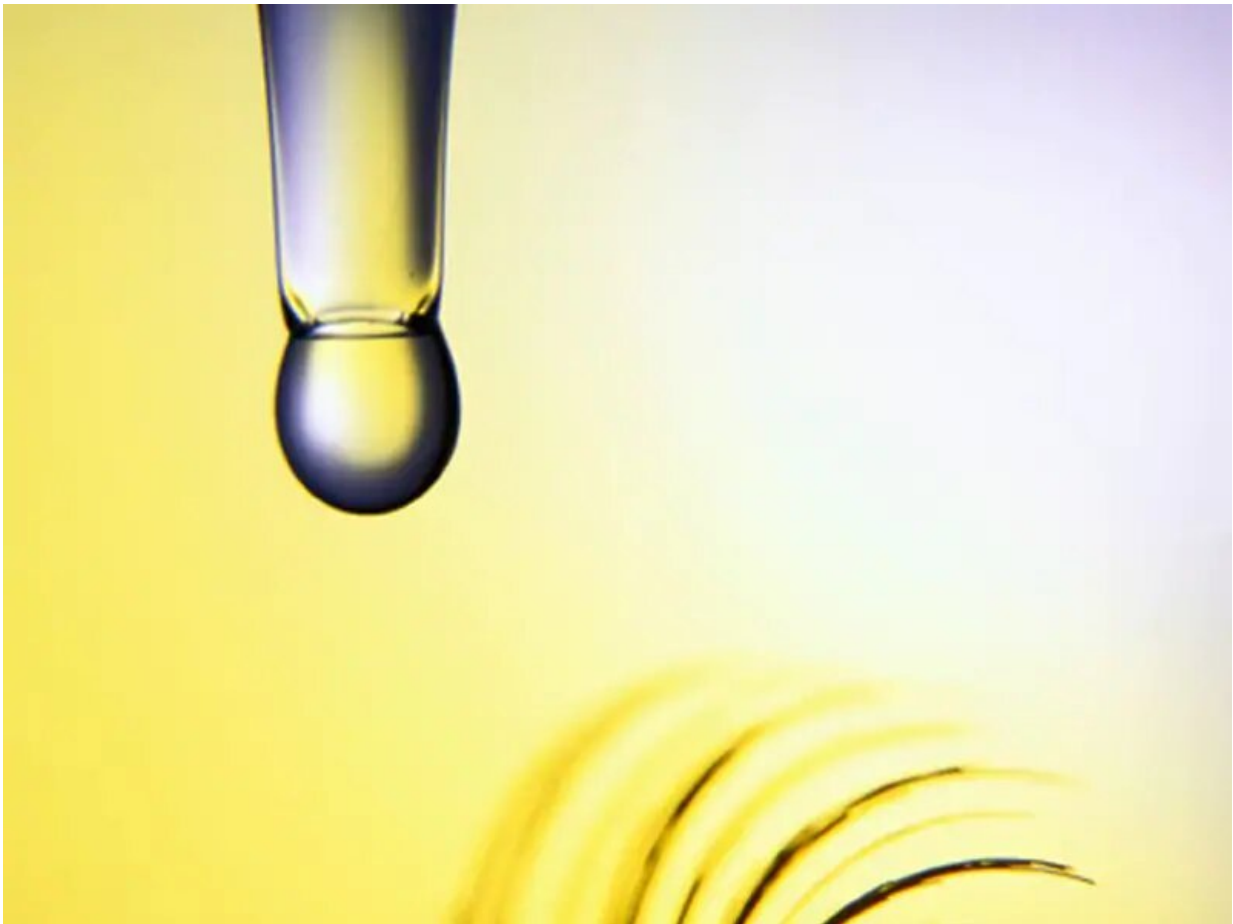


# Netarsudil lowers IOP in glaucoma, ocular hypertension

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(HealthDay)—Netarsudil ophthalmic solution (0.02 percent; once daily)

significantly reduced mean intraocular pressure (IOP) among patients with open-angle glaucoma or ocular hypertension, according to a study published in the August issue of the *American Journal of Ophthalmology*.

In a double-masked, randomized, phase 3, noninferiority study, Albert S. Khouri, M.D., from the Rutgers New Jersey School of Medicine in Newark, and colleagues randomly assigned patients with open-angle glaucoma or [ocular hypertension](#) (unmedicated baseline IOP >20 to

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
