

Childhood food insecurity tied to poor health outcomes, developmental risk

(HealthDay)—Food insecurity is associated with fair or poor health and

developmental risk but not with obesity, underweight, or stunting, among children under 4 years old, according to a study published online Sept. 9 in *Pediatrics*.

Chloe R. Drennen, M.D., from the University of Maryland School of Medicine, and colleagues surveyed caregivers of young children to examine how [food insecurity](#) relates to obesity, underweight, stunting, health, and development among children
