

Six states set records for COVID-19 hospitalizations

(HealthDay)—Records for COVID-19 hospitalizations were set Tuesday

in six states—Arkansas, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

Another state, Oklahoma, had its highest number of hospitalizations since July, according to *The Washington Post*.

Wyoming's 36.7 percent increase since last week in its rolling seven-week average of hospitalizations was the largest of any state.

Increases in rolling seven-week averages for hospitalized patients also occurred in a number of other states, including Delaware, Michigan, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Utah, Indiana, New York, and Iowa, *The Post* reported.
