

Salmonella linked to pet turtles has hospitalized five, CDC says

Tiny turtles are the cause of a multistate outbreak of salmonella that has



led to five hospitalizations, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said Thursday.

The agency has linked an <u>outbreak that has infected at least 15 people</u> in 11 states to turtles that are less than 4 inches long.

Most of the small reptiles were purchased online, about half from a website called myturtlestore.com.

Federal law bans the sale of small turtles as pets.

A CDC report on the investigation said the true number of people infected is likely higher, but many recover without testing or <u>medical</u> <u>care</u>. In the known cases, many of those infected are children.

Typically, <u>salmonella infection</u> includes diarrhea, fever and <u>stomach</u> <u>cramps</u> that develop sometime between six hours and six days after exposure to the bacteria.

The illness usually lasts about four to seven days, though some people will develop <u>severe symptoms</u> requiring hospitalization. Children younger than 5, adults 65 and older and <u>people with weakened immune systems</u> are especially vulnerable.

The CDC advises not buying turtles with shells that are less than 4 inches long. The agency says turtles longer than 4 inches should be purchased only from reputable pet stores or rescues. Here are some of the CDC's other recommendations:

- Don't get a turtle if you are in a group more vulnerable to salmonella.
- Stay healthy by always washing your hands after touching, feeding or caring for your turtle. Ensure that your children are



- also washing their hands well after handling the turtle.
- If you have a turtle you no longer want, do not discard it. Call your local pet store or reptile rescue for help.

State health departments can answer questions about infections in specific states.
