

Cucumbers sold in 14 states recalled over salmonella concerns

A company recall has been issued for cucumbers sold in 14 states because of possible contamination with salmonella.



In a <u>notice</u> posted by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, Floridabased Fresh Start Produce recalled the vegetables, which were shipped from May 17 through May 21.

The <u>cucumbers</u> were sent to retail distribution centers, wholesalers and food service distributors in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, North Carolina, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia, the company said. Mini cucumbers and English cucumbers are not included in the recall.

The recall was issued after a cucumber sample that was tested by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture was found to be positive for salmonella.

The FDA is now conducting genetic testing to see whether it's related to an ongoing salmonella outbreak.

Fresh Start Produce notified its customers that received recalled cucumbers directly from the company about the recall and asked that they notify their own customers of the recall.

The cucumbers are "unlikely in the marketplace," the company said, but customers can check with retailers to determine whether recalled cucumbers were sold there.

Any of these cucumbers should be discarded or returned to the store, the company said. Consumers with additional questions can call the company at 1-888-364-2993 anytime from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Symptoms of a <u>salmonella infection</u> include diarrhea, fever and <u>stomach</u> <u>cramps</u> that can start within hours or days of consuming contaminated food. Most people recover with treatment, but <u>severe symptoms</u>,



symptoms that don't improve or signs of dehydration should prompt a visit to the doctor, the CDC says. Children, the elderly and people with weakened immune systems are more likely to become severely ill.

"In rare circumstances, infection with salmonella can result in the organism getting into the bloodstream and producing more severe illnesses such as arterial infections [i.e., infected aneurysms], endocarditis and arthritis," the recall notice said.
